#### **TESS Summative Evaluation Pilot**

For the 2021-2022 academic year, EPPs across the state are using the TESS Summative Evaluation Rubric adopted by Arkansas DESE. It has been formalized as a state-approved exit assessment for candidate pedagogical knowledge in place of the existing requirement (i.e., ETS Principles of Teaching and Learning). Capstone interns will not be required to take and pass the PLT as long as they meet a minimum average score of 2.0 (Progressing).

**NOTE:** Candidates in **EVERY** program still have to complete the **3 edTPA Tasks** as part of their capstone portfolio (20%) that is uploaded and scored in LiveText because it is a key assessment for CAEP.

# **Higher Education Program Revisions for 2021-2022**

<u>Arkansas competencies</u> for many licensure areas have been updated in response to changes to national standards and licensure assessments. The following areas need to submit Program Revisions by **February 1, 2022**: Age 3-4 Endorsement, Middle School Social Studies (4-8), Agriculture (7-12), Math (7-12), PE/Health (K-12), Life Science-Biology (7-12), Gifted & Talented (K-12), and Guidance & School Counseling (K-12).
